

Conserving Additional Land Along Ridley Brook ~

DLT's Latest Project



Several Years ago, the Cook family approached the Duxbury Land Trust (DLT) because they wanted to conserve their Ridley Brook property. With the help of a Vermont Housing and Conservation (VHCB) grant awarded to the DLT in June, the Cooks' wish may be realized next spring. This acquisition is in keeping with the Land Trust's focus on conserving riparian resources along the Winooski River and its tributaries. Purchasing this land will increase Ridley Brook conserved land to more than twenty-nine acres.

Adjacent to DLT-owned land located at the corner of Camel's Hump and Scrabble Hill Roads, the 13 acre Cook property is bordered by approximately 1000 feet of frontage on the Ridley Brook in North Duxbury. The property features a spectacular waterfall, two balancing rocks, and a mature hemlock - hardwood northern forest. It supports a variety of wildlife and provides recreational opportunities such as fishing, swimming, and even kayaking.

This project is being made possible by the Cooks' generosity through a bargain sale and the \$20,000 VHCB grant. In addition, the VHCB awarded \$6,000 to the Vermont Land Trust to fund stewardship and monitoring of the conservation easement, ensuring that the property will be conserved in perpetuity. We still need to raise \$22,000 to complete the sale, cover closing costs, and

establish a fund for property management, stewardship, and ongoing property taxes.

So far the DLT Trustees have raised nearly \$3000 toward the \$22,000 through a special event, designated contributions, and donations in memory of Robert "Bo" Haslam, a founding board member. That leaves a balance of \$19,000, which we hope to achieve through a combination of individual donations and other fundraising efforts.
